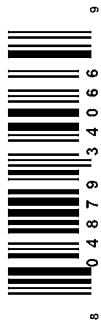

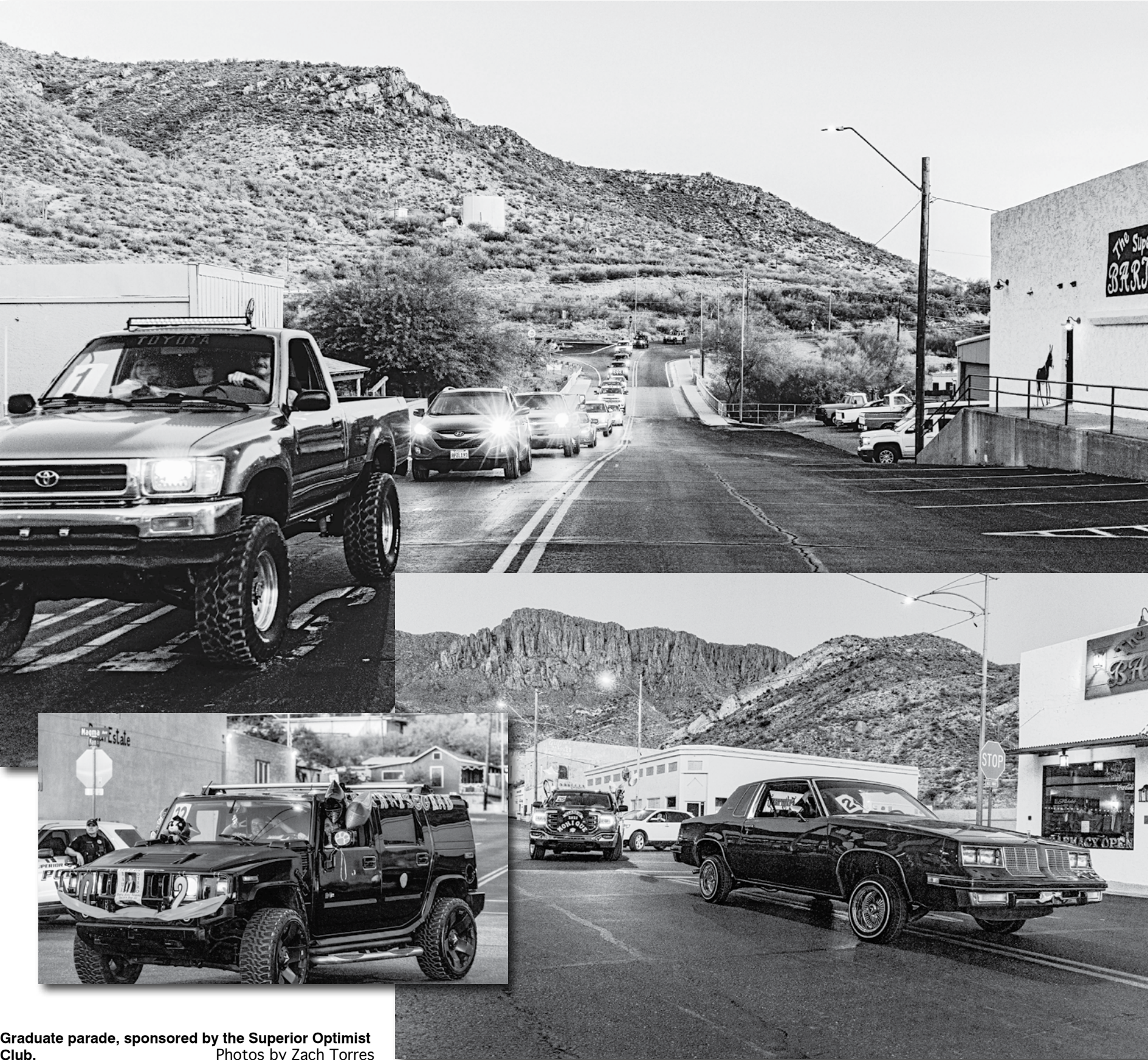

Wildfire destroys buildings in Riverside

Last Wednesday, a wildfire in the Riverside area grew to approximately 20 acres before firefighters were able to get it under control. The Simmons Fire destroyed multiple structures and other personal property before being extinguished.

Joanna Almaraz’s home was destroyed along with an

unoccupied house, several sheds, a shop building, an RV and other vehicles. Joann told the Copper Basin News that she had just changed shifts at work or she might have been asleep in her house.

There were no injuries or deaths.

According to Tiffany Davila of the State Forestry

Department, the fire was sparked by someone grinding and then spread to multiple structures.

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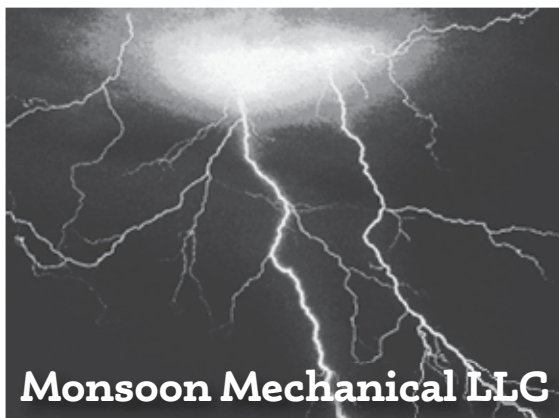
